Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Has there ever been a time in our lifetimes when the words of today's gospel were more desperately needed, or more thoughtlessly unheeded? The Church has written so many encyclicals about the right use of wealth, and today those words are about as popular as the Ten Commandments, of Amos' railing against the corrupt rich in his day, or of the story of Lazarus and Dives.

We all have our theories of how bitter lies are somehow taken for truths, especially lies about those who are poor, and how they got that way.

When St. John Paul II defended the primacy of labor in his encyclical "Laborem Exercens" (1981), he was derided by a columnist in Fortune magazine for being "wedded to socialist economics and increasingly a sucker for Third World anti-imperialist rhetoric."

As John McKenzie, SJ wrote, reflecting on St. John Paul II's prophetic voice, "They saw him as a benighted Pole who failed to understand the sanctifying grace of consumerism."

Are we guilty of the crimes that Amos attributed to his own people: self-indulgence, frivolous distraction, willful ignorance, and cruel neglect of the poor?

Paul's first letter to Timothy—that beautiful second reading today—reveals the kind of persons we might be: people of integrity, kindness, piety, steadfastness, and love, people who fight the good fight of faith, people of true nobility.

Conservative commentator and Orthodox Jew Ben Shapiro asked atheist Bill Maher this question: "Why do you and I agree on morality like 87.5%? We both grew up in Western society, which has thousands of years of Biblical morality behind it."

We are the inheritors of this morality. Dives is not the hero of this story.

In what ways are you taking care of Lazarus at your door?

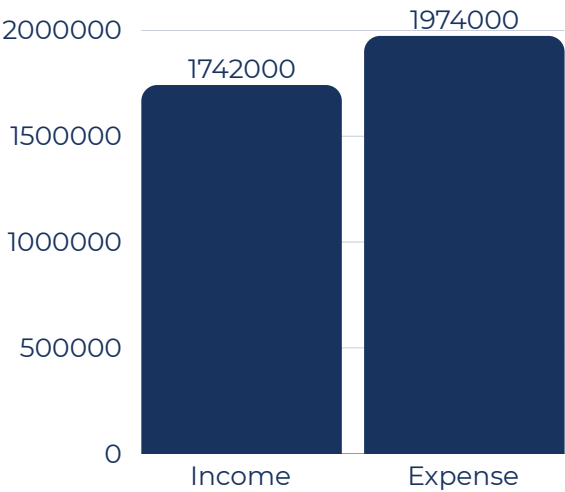

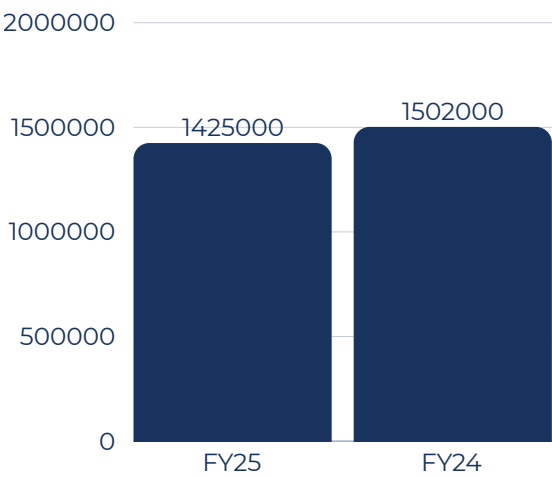
INCOME & EXPENSE FY 2025

- Our parish is financially healthy with sufficient cash reserves
- The parish building is 17 years old and the rectory is over 60 years old, both require increasing maintenance
- Operating costs continue to increase to support our growing parish and inflation
- Negative net income limits our ability to support our growing parish community



2 YEAR TREND OF OFFERTORY

- Offertory provides the funds needed to pay staff and fund the expenses for liturgy, programs, facility maintenance, dioceses assessments and charitable giving
- As a growing parish, we are dependent upon a growing offertory which grew 4% from 2019 to 2024, even with Covid. Unfortunately, the offertory decreased last year, failing to fully fund our annual expenses.





Vigésimo Sexto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

¿Acaso habremos tenido algún momento en nuestras vidas en el que las palabras del evangelio de hoy fueran más necesarias y a la misma vez más ignoradas? La Iglesia ha escrito muchísimas encíclicas sobre el uso correcto de la riqueza, y hoy esas palabras son tan populares como los Diez Mandamientos, las críticas de Amós contra los ricos corruptos de su época o la historia de Lázaro y el Hombre Rico.

Todos tenemos nuestras teorías sobre cómo las amargas mentiras se toman por verdades, especialmente las mentiras sobre los pobres, y cómo esto llega a suceder.

Cuando San Juan Pablo II defendió la importancia del trabajo en su encíclica “Laborem Exercens” (1981), un columnista de la revista Fortune lo ridiculizó por estar “casado con la economía socialista y cada vez más atraído por la retórica antiimperialista del Tercer Mundo”. Como escribió John McKenzie, SJ, reflexionando sobre la voz profética de San Juan Pablo II: «Lo veían como un polaco ignorante que no comprendía la gracia santificadora del consumismo».

¿Somos culpables de los crímenes que Amós atribuyó a su propio pueblo: autocomplacencia, distracción frívola, ignorancia deliberada y cruel descuido de los pobres?

La primera carta de Pablo a Timoteo —esa hermosa segunda lectura de hoy— revela el tipo de personas que podríamos ser: personas íntegras, bondadosas, piadosas, firmes y amorosas, personas que luchan la buena batalla de la fe, personas de verdadera nobleza.

El comentarista conservador y judío ortodoxo Ben Shapiro le preguntó al ateo Bill Maher: “¿Por qué tú y yo estamos de acuerdo en la moralidad en un 87,5%? Ambos crecimos en la sociedad occidental, que tiene miles de años de moralidad bíblica como respaldo”.

Somos los herederos de esta moralidad. El Hombre Rico no es el héroe de esta historia.

¿De qué maneras estás cuidando al Lázaro que está en tu puerta?

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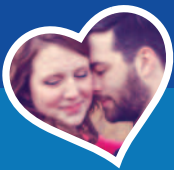

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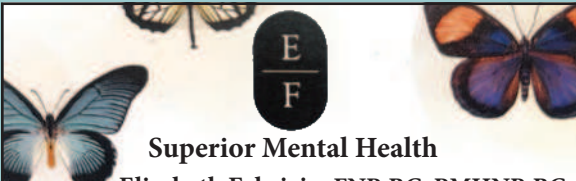
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
