Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time



It's sobering to stand at the Western Wall in Jerusalem. It is an ancient retaining wall on the hill known as the Temple Mount. Visitors place prayers on tiny pieces of paper and press them into the crevices of the last remaining wall of King Herod's Temple.

Even the great builder Herod couldn't construct a complex strong enough to withstand the Roman assault on Jerusalem in 70AD. The Romans knew that destroying the Temple would break the Jewish will to fight. This was a devastating event for the Jewish people, leading to the scattering of survivors, and ending a key era in Judaism.

It's precisely this terrifying event that Jesus is warning of in today's gospel (Luke 21:5-19). "The days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down." Imagine standing there today and seeing these huge boulders, still broken and scattered from the terrible Roman-Jewish War of 70AD.

We know so little of what became of those disciples to whom Jesus spoke these eerily prophetic words. Tradition says that all but John were martyred, although scripture only tells of the deaths of the two men named James.

Was it troublesome to the early Church to witness the deaths of the eyewitnesses? Doesn't Jesus promise that "not a hair on your head will be destroyed"? The earliest Christians knew that the Crucified One rose from the grave, and they understood that the martyrs would share the same victory.

No need to worry, though. This was all 2,000 years ago. Except that Jesus also says, "There will be powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues from place to place."

How do you live in joyful hope of the Kingdom of God?

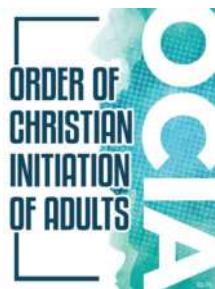


Next weekend, our tithing partner is

Trigésimo-Tercer Domingo de Tiempo Ordinario

Estar frente al Muro de las Lamentaciones en Jerusalén te hace reflexionar. Se trata de un antiguo muro de contención en la colina conocida como el Monte del Templo. Los visitantes escriben oraciones en pequeños trozos de papel y las meten entre las grietas del último muro que queda del Templo del rey Herodes.

Ni siquiera el gran constructor Herodes pudo levantar un complejo lo suficientemente fuerte como para resistir el asalto romano a Jerusalén en el año 70 d. C. Los romanos sabían que destruir el Templo quebraría la voluntad de lucha de los judíos. Este fue un acontecimiento devastador para el pueblo judío, que provocó la dispersión de los supervivientes y puso fin a una era clave del judaísmo.

Es precisamente este aterrador acontecimiento del que Jesús advierte en el evangelio de hoy (Lucas 21:5-19). «Llegarán días en que no quedará piedra sobre piedra que no sea derribada». Imagínese estar allí hoy y ver esas enormes rocas, aún quebradas y esparcidas tras la terrible guerra judeo-romana del año 70 d. C. Sabemos muy poco sobre el destino de aquellos discípulos a quienes Jesús dirigió esas palabras tan proféticas. La tradición afirma que todos, excepto Juan, fueron martirizados, aunque las Escrituras solo narran la muerte de dos hombres llamados Santiago.

¿Le resultó doloroso a la Iglesia primitiva presenciar la muerte de los testigos oculares? ¿Acaso Jesús no promete que «ni un cabello de nuestra cabeza será destruido»? Los primeros cristianos sabían que el Crucificado resucitó de entre los muertos y comprendían que los mártires compartirían la misma victoria.

Pero no hay de qué preocuparse. Todo esto sucedió hace 2000 años. Sin embargo, Jesús también dice: «Habrá grandes terremotos, hambrunas y plagas en distintos lugares».

¿Cómo vives la gozosa esperanza del Reino de Dios?

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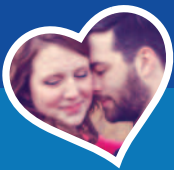
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
