Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

I don't generally think of John the Baptist as a dreamer, or a star-gazer. But today he admits to seeing a vision: *I saw the Spirit come down like a dove from heaven and remain upon him.*

Why do these biblical figures have visions and dreams, and we don't? My great Denver friend Fr. Pat Dolan thinks that modern humans have "evolved" away from the deep gifts of intuition and "seeing" that was common to the ancients. Two thousand years ago, the great Baptizer met Jesus, reluctantly complied with his wish to be baptized, and then actually saw the Spirit descend upon him.

But here's the thing: I think we, too, often see the Spirit descend. Think of your favorite homilist. Don't you "see" the Spirit descend when he digs deep into the scriptures and gives you something rich and beautiful upon which to meditate?

Watch your friends with their grandchildren. Years and years of parenting seem to have given them a sixth sense about how to listen to these dear ones, how to truly "see" them, and how to navigate their temporary whining and bring them back to that gentle place of delight and content that makes being with them such a joy.

Or think of the musicians you know. Watch them sit down at the piano and take mastery of it. Can you see the Spirit descend? Think of any person you love, really. Aren't there many times a day when you "see" the Spirit descend as they bring kindness into the world?

Make this the year when you pay closer attention to the Spirit's "descent." Chances are, the Spirit hovers over you all the time. *What person in your life seems to have the Spirit's presence always?*

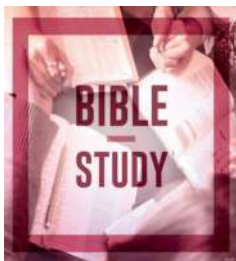

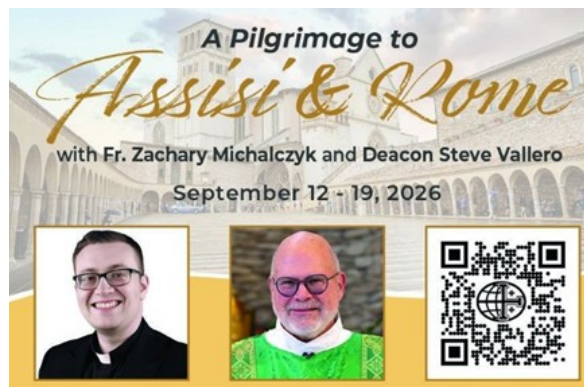

Rekindle: Catholic Faith for Adults — Symbolon Part 1

Rekindle: Growing Deeper in Your Catholic Faith is a 9-

The program is organized into four
distinct study modules, each focusing on a key aspect
of Catholic life — the liturgy, our
beliefs, the sacraments and moral life, and prayer.
It is ideal for adults who wish to return to the practice
of their faith, those seeking to
strengthen their understanding of Catholic teaching,
and any parishioner who wants to
grow spiritually in community.

Each module runs independently, and participants
may join at any of the four break points, making Re-
kindle a flexible, welcoming pathway for everyone.
Sessions meet weekly and include prayer, high-quality
video presentations, and small-group
discussion in a relaxed and friendly environment. Par-
ticipants may choose to attend either
Tuesday mornings (9:30–11:00 AM) or Wednesday
evenings (6:30–8:00 PM). The
schedule includes time off during Advent and Christ-
mas, Holy Week, and the Easter season.

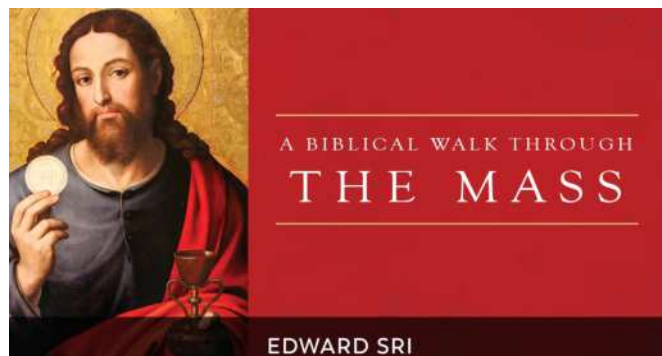

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Mateo 3:13-17



Las lecturas de hoy nos presentan al prometido por Dios desde el Antiguo Testamento. Al ser bautizado por Juan, Jesús asume su misión pública, nada fácil, por cierto. Sin embargo, no está solo. El Espíritu Santo lo acompañará a lo largo de su vida y misión. “En ese momento se abrieron los cielos y vio al Espíritu de Dios que bajaba como una paloma y se posaba sobre él. Al mismo tiempo, se oyó una voz del cielo que decía: ‘Este es mi Hijo, el Amado; en él me complazco’”. (Mateo 3:16-17). La liturgia de este domingo nos invita a descubrir la magnitud de nuestro bautismo. Desde ese día, el Espíritu Santo nos acompaña y guía en cada momento de nuestra vida. Solo basta con dejarlo actuar, y hará maravillas en nosotros. ¿Sabes la fecha y el día de tu bautismo? ¿Conoces el nombre del sacerdote que te dio el sacramento?

“Los bautizados se han revestido de Cristo” (Gálatas 3:27). “Por el Espíritu Santo, el bautismo es un baño que purifica, santifica y justifica” (Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, #1227). Todos somos hijos e hijas de Dios por el bautismo. Desde su bautismo, Jesús pasó haciendo el bien durante su vida terrena. Por lo tanto, nuestro compromiso como bautizados debe ser el mismo: ¡hacer el bien!

¡Devociones, explicadas! Bendición de San Blas para la Garganta

Mini Explicación — Ideal para las redes sociales o en su boletín: Los católicos tradicionalmente reciben una bendición de la garganta en la fiesta de San Blas (3 de febrero), quien fue obispo y mártir de la Armenia del siglo IV. Durante la bendición, se forma una cruz con dos velas benditas que se sostienen sobre la garganta.

Bendición de San Blas para la Garganta, Explicada Tal vez sea un ejemplo de la divina providencia que la fiesta de San Blas caiga el 3 de febrero, ¡justo en medio de la temporada de resfriados y gripe! Este santo armenio del siglo IV fue obispo y mártir y es venerado como el patrón de aquellos que sufren de enfermedades de la garganta.

En el día de su fiesta, los católicos reciben tradicionalmente una bendición de la garganta. Esta bendición es administrada por un sacerdote, diácono o un ministro laico que sigue los ritos y oraciones designados para un laico. Durante la bendición, el ministro toma dos velas que fueron bendecidas en la fiesta de la Presentación y hace una cruz frente a la garganta, diciendo: "Por la intercesión de San Blas, obispo y mártir, que Dios te libre de toda enfermedad de la garganta y de cualquier otra enfermedad". A continuación, un sacerdote o diácono hará la señal de la cruz.

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
