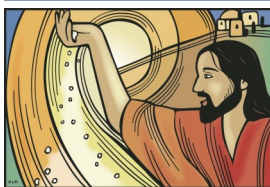

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Here's an earthy explanation for Jesus' words about salt, and how, after it loses its taste, is good for nothing but to be trampled underfoot.

In Israel, even today, many prefer cooking in clay ovens rather than on electric stoves. These ovens have been around since ancient times, and are undoubtedly what Jesus refers to when he speaks of the importance of salt. The common fuel for these communal ovens was camel or donkey dung. It was the task of the girls in the family to gather the dung, mix salt in it, mold it into patties, and leave them in the sun to dry.

A slab of salt was placed at the base of the oven, and upon it the salted dung patty. Salt has catalytic properties that cause it to burn, so food can be cooked. Dung fuel is still used today. Eventually, of course, the salt loses its catalytic capacity and becomes useless. Jesus says it's good for nothing but to be thrown outside, where it can still provide sure footing in a muddy road. Jesus is so earthy, so at home with the family life of his listeners. No wonder crowds followed him everywhere he went.

I recently read a book that I think you would love. Theo of Golden (by Allen Levi), demonstrates for the reader how to bring light to the world. As one reviewer put it, You think you're settling into a quiet story about companionship, but before you know it, you're rethinking what it means to live a meaningful life.

It's like receiving a warm hug, or someone turning on the light in a dark room. It's what the world needs now.

Who in your life is like salt, bringing joy and Light?

Quinto Domingo de Tiempo Ordinario

Aquí hay una explicación sencilla de las palabras de Jesús sobre la sal, y cómo, una vez que pierde su sabor, no sirve para nada más que para ser pisoteada.

En Israel, incluso hoy en día, muchos prefieren cocinar en hornos de barro en lugar de estufas eléctricas. Estos hornos existen desde la antigüedad y, sin duda, son a lo que Jesús se refiere cuando habla de la importancia de la sal.

El combustible común para estos hornos comunales era el estiércol de camello o burro. Las niñas de la familia se encargaban de recoger el estiércol, mezclarlo con sal, moldearlo en tortitas y dejarlas secar al sol. Se colocaba una placa de sal en la base del horno, y sobre ella la tortita de estiércol salado. La sal tiene propiedades catalíticas que la hacen arder, permitiendo cocinar los alimentos. El estiércol como combustible todavía se utiliza hoy en día.

Con el tiempo, claro, la sal pierde su capacidad catalítica y se vuelve inútil. Jesús dice que no sirve para nada, solo para ser arrojada afuera, donde aún puede proporcionar un paso firme en un camino fangoso. Jesús es tan cotidiano, tan acoplado a la vida real de sus oyentes. No nos sorprende que las multitudes lo siguieran adondequiera que iba.

Hace poco leí un libro que creo que te encantaría. Se llama Theo of Golden (de Allen Levi) y le muestra al lector cómo iluminar el mundo. Como dijo un crítico: «Crees que te estás adentrando en una historia tranquila que trata sobre compañerismo, pero en realidad, te estás replanteando lo que significa vivir una vida plena. Es como recibir un cálido abrazo o que alguien encienda la luz en una habitación oscura. Es lo que el mundo necesita ahora».

¿Quién en tu vida es como la sal, trayendo alegría y luz?

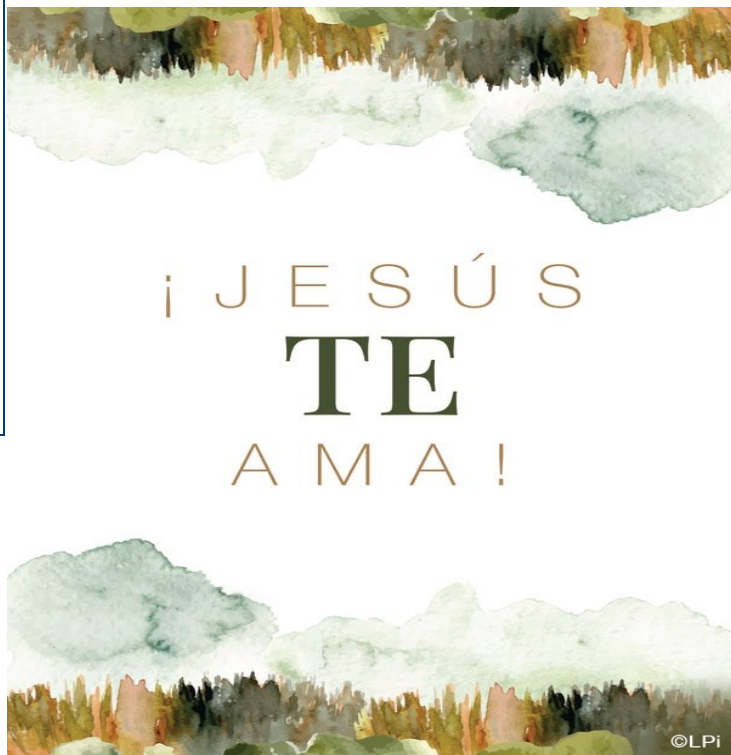

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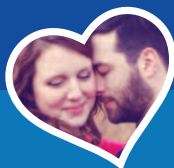

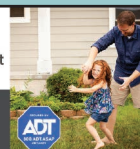


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
